One of the vital rights is Article 31 of the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child, which states that every child has the right to relax, play, and take part in cultural and creative activities. Whether it's imaginative games, outdoor adventures, or creative activities, we make sure every child has the time and space to enjoy their right to play.

Internet Safety:

Each month we will be looking at using electronic devises safely at home and sharing helpful tips. We need to keep our children safe and help them to understand how to play games, use the internet and different devises safely.
