This year we will be working towards reaccrediting out Rights Resecting Award.
All staff have now had training about this wonderful initiative.

On 10th December 1948, the Universal Declaration of Human Rights was adopted by the United Nations General Assembly. This important moment in human history is now remembered on that date every year and is known as Human Rights Day. All children have the same human rights as adults. Ask your children about their right to play and privacy.

### Internet Safety:

Each month we will be looking at using electronic devises safely at home. We need to keep our children safe and help them to understand how to play games, use the internet and different devises safely. This month's message is 'Permanent Marker' Everything that you put on line is PERMANENT even if you hit the delete button! Remember to really think about what you share on line about yourself but also your children, family and friends.
